Dr. Martin D. Jenkins Scholar Award Program Overview & Schedule

Purpose. This student award is named in honor of Dr. Jenkins, Father of Research on Gifted Blacks, and it is designed to honor the achievements of highly gifted Black students who excel academically in school.

Eligibility. Applicants must be a Black student enrolled in a public school in grades 6-12 or college and meet at least three of the following criteria:

1. **Exceptional Test Score**
2. **Accelerated**
3. **Exemplary achievement**
4. **Early Entrance, MS Dual Enrollment, HS Joint Enrollment**
5. **Exemplary School Work**
6. **Competition Winner**

Award Benefits. Recipients:

- will receive \$300 scholarship (cash award) and NAGC convention registration.
 - are required to attend a featured session at NAGC on **Saturday, November 5, 2016.**
 - are required to share a brief end of year school report and academic progress update.
 - will have access to various Ambassador Programming & Peer Mentoring opportunities
 - will be invited to participate in the Jenkins Scholar Alumni Network after 1st year in program.
- Parents will receive 1-year Parent Membership in NAGC and Special Populations Network.*

Applicants must be a student enrolled in a public school in grades 6-12 or college and meet at least three of the following criteria, which are aligned with expected outcomes from NAGC Pre-K to Grade 12 Gifted Education Programming Standards.

<p>5. Exemplary School Work. Provide a sample of work (DVD or video link) that sets this student/applicant apart from his/her peers in a specific gifted category or content area discipline. Assessment: Learning Progress and Outcomes – demonstrate advanced and complex learning as a result of multiple, appropriate, ongoing assessments</p>
<p>6. Competition Winner. Won state, regional, national or international status in an academic or arts competition (e.g., chess, science, mathematics, arts, leadership, forensics, engineering). Provide copy of award letter or other evidence, along with a statement explaining the significance of the competition.</p>	<p>3.4. Instructional Strategies – become independent investigators 4.1. Personal Competence – demonstrate growth for exceptional academic and creative productivity 4.4.
